# 80th Anniversary of Hiroshima and Nagasaki's A-Bombs

The Peace Memorial Ceremonies are held annually in Hiroshima and Nagasaki on the days that the A-Bombs were dropped. Representing A-Bomb survivors in Nagasaki, Mr. Seiichiro Mise, (Age 89), who is a member of the Kogenji temple, (my family's temple), delivered his "Pledge for Peace" at the



Nagasaki Peace Memorial Ceremony on August 9, 2024. Let me introduce it to think about peace.

### "Pledge for Peace"

I was age ten. It was during summer break. An air-raid alarm was lifted in the morning. My grandmother and mother began washing clothes and cooking lunch. I was trying to copy the sound of the B-29 bomber by playing the organ. My grandmother came in a flurry and shouted at me, "Stop doing it. People may be confused if a B-29 comes." I reluctantly obeyed and closed the organ. When I stood up, there was a sudden gleam of light.

As I learned at school, right away, I closed my ears and eyes and laid down by the organ. The next moment, I heard a dull booming sound, and a boom blast blew through my house. Frightened, I just stayed there. After a while, it became silent. I fearfully raised my head and looked around. It was a frightful sight. I was stunned at the sight and felt as if the sun had dropped onto the earth. My mother was terrified and looked for her children in panic. Fortunately, my family of eight were all fine and no one was injured.



The next few days, we cleaned our house. My friend and I also worried about our school, Irabayashi elementary school, so we went to look. There, we saw people who were stripped to the waist, injured, and covered in blood. We could not recognize their gender. They kept saying, "Give me water. I want to drink water." The injured people were carried inside the school's gym, but no one was giving them any water and treatment. They were just laid down there. It was hot and the gym was filled with nasty smells. It was as if it was hell.



People were screaming because of the pain. The next moment, they suddenly became quiet and died. Adults held dead people's heads and legs and carried them out to the school ground. They dug a hole, put the dead bodies on wooden boards, and cremated them. I can never forget the scene of my school's ground being used as a crematorium.

Seventy-nine years have passed since then. We, A-bomb survivors, have always worried about our health and have been demanding the abolition of nuclear weapons. However, when we see this world now, Wars in Ukraine and Palestine are bogged down rather than moving toward peace, and many children's lives are taken.

I hear and see this sorrowful reality. I cannot look away from it and I feel how foolish the act of war is. I deeply appreciate how precious Peace is every day.



### Kusunoki, continued



It is said that there are 12,120 nuclear warheads in this world today. We hear news about the possibility of using nuclear weapons. This world is in such a state that it is a tinderbox waiting to explode. If worse comes to the worse and a nuclear weapon is used somewhere, the whole earth could be destroyed.

I would like to ask Prime Minister Kishida to preserve this beautiful earth, for our children to live at ease. To achieve this, I strongly wish that Japan, as the only country that has experienced the A-Bomb, should set the total abolition of nuclear weapons in this world as the most important task and sincerely work to accomplish it.

Since 2015 I, as a member of Nagasaki Peace Promotion Committee, have been conveying the fear of nuclear weapons to youth and students who visit Nagasaki. I have also begun sharing my experience in English since 2023. I would like to keep thinking and learning about what Peace is with everyone. I continue devoting myself for world peace as long as I can.

In conclusion, I share these words with you. "Peace is World heritage shared by all humankind." It is my "Pledge for Peace" and I offer this to all A-Bomb victims who have already died.
