It is our great honor to host the 78th Northwest Buddhist Convention and the Buddhist Churches of America National Council Meeting. We wish to welcome our distinguished guests, our Dharma friends, and all members of Northwest Sangha and all BCA temple delegates.



We hosted the 73rd Northwest Convention and BCA National Council meeting in February 2020. Right after the Convention, the Covid-19 pandemic happened, and everything was shut down. All BCA temples had to close their doors. Each temple used their creativity and tried to continue providing their activities and services.

As many temples were reopening and resumed their full activities, Seattle Betsuin had an arson fire on December 31, 2023. Seattle Betsuin has not been able to have any services in the hondo since then. We are hoping to have a temple soft opening in sSpring, 2026. Seattle Betsuin celebrates their 125th anniversary and the completion of its restoration in November 2026. It is the year to renew our temple.

We picked the theme “Renewal – Jodo Shinshu for Today.” It is a great opportunity to share how we are restoring our temple building and programs after the Covid-19 pandemic and the fire. Seattle Betsuin is republishing the English translation of Rennyo’s Letters, (Gobunsho), which was they originally published in 1976. Rennyo Shonin is also called “Great Restorer” in our tradition. We can learn from his words and his life how he delivered Jodo Shinshu over 500 years ago.

How can we make Nembutsu thrive at your local temple, in your city, and in this world? How can we make Nembutsu thrive within ourselves today? Jodo Shinshu’s Nembutsu path is the path for all bonbu, (ordinary beings), to be liberated from human suffering and to attain perfect enlightenment. As we all enjoy walking this Nembutsu path, let us use this opportunity to share our joy with each other.

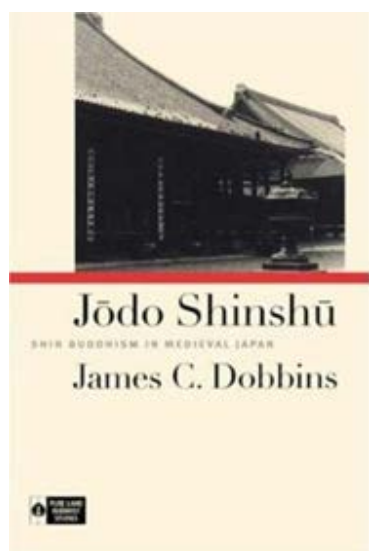

Rev. Tadao Koyama, resident minister at Tacoma Buddhist Temple talks about the significance of HoOnKo. He describes Shinran Shonin's path that leads him to encounter Honen Shonin and his admonishment to just say the Nembutsu as described in the Larger Sutra. As Jodo Shinshu Buddhists we acknowledge who we are, our human-ness. Shakyamuni Buddha's teaching show us how to find relief from the suffering caused by our human weaknesses – say, Namo Amida Butsu.
